Body Language: How you communicate using your body

Rhetorical Questions: Ask the audience to think.

Stage Use: Where you stand and how you move during presentation

• PEGS: Posture, Eye Contact, Gestures, Smile

Vocal Variety: Volume variation and speed of speaking

I. Body Language



- Body language plays important role in your presentation.
- Strong body language = confidence.
- Strong body language keeps audience engaged.
- If presenter never moves from one place, it may be boring.
- Strong body language can help your audience understand better.
- Two important areas of body language:
 - Stage use
 - Gestures



I. Body Language



- No matter how small or how bug the stage is, use it!
- Stage using can be friend or enemy!

| When you move deliberately | When you move without any purpose |
|----------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| You will feel calmer | You may block the visuals |
| You will engage audience | You may distract the audience |
| You show confidence | You may look nervous |
| You can organize speech | You seem disorganized and unprepared |

- How to move deliberately?
- You can move when you change ideas.
- You can move to conclude the presentation.

- Move forward to show passion.
- Move backward to show seriousness.

I. Body Language



- Gesture means "to move hands".
- Gesture is a good way to engage your audience.
- Gestures should match what you want to say.
- If you are not gesturing, keep your hands relax.
 - Listing numbers (1,2,3,...) using figures.
 - To show "I/Me/My" point to yourself.
 - Asking audience to do something: point towards audience with palm upside
 - To compare two things, use hands.
 - To point something, use index finger.
- Don't do this









II. Vocal Variety



- Your voice plays important role in showing confidence
- Think how confident person speaks.
- Think how nervous person speaks.
- To show confidence, you must speak carefully, emotionally and loud enough.

II. Vocal Variety



Volume

- Speaking audible means speaking at comfortable volume.
- You don't need to yell, but everyone needs to hear you properly.
- Practice in large room with friends.
- Check how loud you need to speak in order to reach your volume till last person in the room.

Speed

- Speaking carefully is important, but it does not mean to speak very fast.
- Speak fast can cause two problems:
 - If you speak fast, you seem nervous.
 - If you speak fast, audience may not get time to think.
- Don't say "and" between each sentence.
- Instead pause for a moment.

Emotion

- Speaking emotionally means changing your tone and adding expressions.
- If you are saying happy story, sound enthusiastic. If you are telling sad story, use soft voice.

III. Audience Management



Lead the audience

- When you are giving presentation, you are center of attention.
- You have worked hard, and be confident.
- You need to show confidence.
- You need to control the room.
- You need to lead your audience.

How to show confidence?

- It is okay to be nervous. Even the best speakers also feel nervous before presenting!
- Good speaker learns to control nervousness.
- So, how to control nervousness?
- It is easy to show confidence. Remember four things about body Language.
